The meeting was called to order by Vice President Lukowicz at 6:30 PM. A quorum was present consisting of: Vice-President Lukowicz, Cindy Fagan-Perry, Ron Flynn and Carl Mattson. District Administrator Daniel Kaplan, Chief Frank Brown, Legal counsel David M. D'Agostino, Esq. of Gorham & Gorham and Accountant Linda Dykeman were also present. President Gralinski, Director Lantz, Director Polselli and District Manager Corrigan were excused. After the pledge, Vice President Lukowicz reviewed safety instructions for exiting the room.

A motion to accept the minutes from December 27, 2018 was made by Director Fagan-Perry, seconded by Director Mattson and unanimously approved.

Chief Frank Brown read the Fire Chief's Report into the record. A motion to accept the Chief's report was made by Director Fagan-Perry, seconded by Director Mattson and unanimously approved.

District Administrator Kaplan read the Tax Collection Report into the record. A motion to accept the Administrator's report was made by Director Flynn, seconded by Director Fagan-Perry and unanimously approved.

The District Manager's Financial Report was read into the record and explained by Accountant Linda Dykeman. She noted that all items were where they should be at this time. A motion to accept the report was made by Director Flynn, seconded by Director Fagan-Perry and unanimously approved.

Under New Business, the FY2018 Audit Report was summarized by Linda Dykeman. She explained that new regulations pertaining to pension reporting were reflected in the audit report. A motion to accept the report was made by Director Flynn, seconded by Director Mattson and unanimously approved.

Abatements totaling \$3,197.87 were read into the record. A motion to accept the abatements was made by Director Fagan-Perry, seconded by Director Mattson and unanimously approved.
