CENTRAL COVENTRY FIRE DISTRICT Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors March 17, 2022 @ 6:30 PM

The meeting was called to order by President Fagan-Perry at 6:31 PM. A quorum was present consisting of: President Cindy Fagan-Perry, Vice President Carl Mattson, Kristen Benoit, Russell McGillivray, Richard Polselli, Legal Counsel David D'Agostino, Esq., of Gorham & Gorham, Inc., Fire Chief Frank M. Brown, District Treasurer Gayle Corrigan, and District Clerk Daniel Kaplan were present. Directors Debra Santilli and Dorothy Berube were excused. President Fagan-Perry led the Pledge of Allegiance and gave instructions for emergency exit. District Clerk Kaplan took a roll call.

A motion to approve the meeting minutes from February 17, 2022, was made by Vice President Mattson, seconded by Director Benoit, and unanimously approved.

The Fire Chief's report was presented by Fire Chief Frank Brown. A motion to approve the report was made by Director Polselli, seconded by Vice President Mattson, and unanimously approved.

The Financial Reports were read by District Treasurer Corrigan. She said that the District will not be able to meet its financial obligations sometime in mid to late June of 2022, consistent with information previously provided to the Board and made part of the CCFD's Corrective Action Plan filed with the State on February 3, 2022. A motion to approve the report was made by Director Polselli, seconded by Vice President Mattson, and unanimously approved.

A motion to approve the District Clerk's Report was made by Director Benoit, seconded by Director McGillivray, and unanimously approved.

New Business:

District Attorney D'Agostino gave an update and report on the status of the Corrective Action Plan submitted to the Chief of Division of Municipal Finance and RI Auditor General on February 3, 2022 as well as recent meetings with State personnel, other fire district representatives and representatives of the Town of Coventry.

Board President Fagan-Perry directed Attorney D'Agostino to make a broad outreach to the General Assembly and neighboring municipalities and

fire districts to press for state support for ARPA funds to the CCFD for transformational changes.

Board President Fagan-Perry directed Treasurer Corrigan to prepare a financial analysis of a 4-platoon model and related options for consideration by the Board and to garner support for State disbursement of ARPA funds.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: None.

A motion to adjourn was made by Director Polselli, seconded by Vice President Mattson and Director McGillivray, and unanimously approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:38 PM.

2022-2023 Contract Negotiations Ground Rules

The following Ground Rules are herein agreed to between the Coventry Fire Fighters, Local No. 3372, International Association of Fire Fighters, AFL-CIO ("Local"), and the Central Coventry Fire District ("District"), (collectively referred to as the "Parties"), for negotiating the 2022-2023 Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the Parties.

- 1. The Parties agree to negotiate in accordance with the Rhode Island Fire Fighters' Arbitration Act R.I. Gen. Laws § 28-9.1 *et seq.* (the "Act").
- 2. The first day of negotiations is Monday, April 18, 2022.
- 3. All future meetings shall be scheduled at a previous meeting.
- 4. All contract proposals shall be in writing. Each Party shall be responsible to maintaining its own notes of the negotiation session.
- 5. There shall be no audio or video recording of any negotiation session by the Parties or their representatives.
- 6. The last day for submitting proposals shall be:
- 7. Written proposals shall be exchanged by and between the Parties at the second day of negotiations, unless otherwise agreed to between the Parties and their representatives.
- 8. No new proposal(s), unless said proposal(s) it is a counterproposal developed during the bargaining of a particular proposal previously submitted, will be exchanged between the Parties after the third day of negotiations.
- 9. All proposals that the Parties have tentatively agreed to during negotiations sessions will be initialed and/or signed by the Parties' representatives. The Parties agree that all items that have received mutual agreement will only be binding on the respective Parties if a new and complete CBA is ratified by both the Local and the District.
- 10. The Parties agree to extend the thirty (30) day period pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws § 28-9.1-7, and that the last day of negotiations between the Parties shall be the date written in paragraph 5, above. If, at the expiration of the negotiating period, the Parties have not agreed to a new CBA, representatives of either Party may seek arbitration in accordance with the Act.
