CENTRAL COVENTRY FIRE DISTRICT Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors May 17, 2018 @ 7:00 PM Westwood Estates Clubhouse

The meeting was called to order by President Gralinski at 7:00 PM. A quorum was present consisting of: President Fred Gralinski, Vice-Chairwoman Lukowicz, Cindy Fagan-Perry, Ronald Flynn, and Richard Polselli. Chief Frank Brown, District Manager Gayle A. Corrigan, District Administrator Dan Kaplan, and legal counsel David M. D'Agostino, Esq., of Gorham & Gorham, Inc. were also present. Director Lantz and Director Quinn were excused. After the pledge, the Chairman reviewed safety instructions for exiting the room.

Director Fagan-Perry noted that the April 19, 2018 minutes were incorrect. The motion to adjourn was incorrectly noted. The meeting minutes will be corrected by District Administrator Kaplan. Motion to approve the minutes as amended made by Director Polselli, seconded by Director Cindy Fagan-Perry and unanimously approved.

Chief Brown read the Fire Chief's Report. The Chief has scheduled the Oral Boards for May 31st for the twelve remaining applicants. The Chief noted that the Fire Fighters have taken it upon themselves with station improvements such as planting grass and plants to enhance the appeal of Stations Four and Seven. Three Lieutenants, Octeau, Bourquin and Marcotte have completed Tactical Medical Training. The Chief also addressed the rumor of an investigation at the Harris Mills complex. There currently is no CCFD investigation of that property. With a \$2,000 grant facilitated by Senator Raptakis the district will purchase laryngoscopes. A motion to approve the report was made by Director Fagan-Perry, seconded by Director Polselli and unanimously approved.

Administrator's report was read by District Administrator Dan Kaplan. Letters of potential tax sale of properties, sent out by the Tax Collector, Ann-Marie Jacolucci, have resulted in an increase in collections. A motion to approve the report by Director Fagan-Perry and seconded by Director Polselli was unanimously approved.

District Manager Corrigan gave the Financial Report; the financials are tracking as expected, around 65%. A motion to approve her report by Director Polselli and seconded by Vice-Chairwoman Lukowicz was unanimously approved.

The Board was presented with a list of properties that were listed for tax abatements. A motion to accept the abatements by Director Fagan-Perry and seconded by Director Flynn was unanimously approved.

Verizon equipment at the Washington Street Station and street lighting in the District will be addressed at the next Board of Directors meeting on June 21st.

A motion to adjourn by Director Polselli and seconded by Director Flynn was unanimously approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 PM.

FIRE CHIEF'S JUNE REPORT

Summary of Operation activities:

PERSONNEL

Currently we have 28 members on staff. 1 member on long term injury (OJI). Oral Board for new Firefighter/EMTC eligibility list was held on May 31st. 12 candidates were interviewed. Final racking is now completed for future hiring. Thanks to Division Chief Blanding, Captain Alamgno, Lieutenant McCann and Firefighter Josh Shannon for their participation in this testing process.

TOTAL PERSONNEL - 29

EMERGENCY INCIDENTS

- *Crews responded to two hazmat incidents. One for a paint primer containing Xylene which is highly flammable that leaked in a basement leaving the residence uninhabitable. Second one was for bleach and ammonia which was mixed together and placed in a freezer. Freezer was removed from basement and chemical was diluted to render it harmless.
- *Crews responded to two electrical fires. One was for a meter socket on the outside of residence that shorted out causing minor damage. Second one was for a fan light/heater within a bathroom that shorted out causing moderate damage.
- *Total Emergency Medical Calls for the month of May was 206.



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APPARATUS

- *All apparatus are up and running properly at this time.
- *New Rescue was be placed in service today.
- *Having boat motor issues with Marine 7. Currently looking at options on repairs or replacement.

EQUIPMENT

All equipment is up and running properly at this time. Air Bags and vehicle struts have been purchased. Glidescope Laryngoscopes have been purchased with Grant Funds.

STATIONS

New roof has been completed at Station 3. On June 26th and 27th we will be using inmates from the RI Department of Correction to cleanout the building.

FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE

Department Fire Marshal's continue to work countless hours on Smoke Detector Inspections, Plan Reviews, Fire Alarm Reviews, Fire Investigations and re-inspections on issued violations.

TRAINING

- *Emergency Medical Technician mandatory recert training is on going.
- *All shifts complete their Annual vehicle extrication training.
- *Training on the new Glidescope Laryngoscopes for will take place before the end of the month.
