The meeting was called to order by President Gralinski at 7:00 PM. A quorum was present consisting of: President Fred Gralinski, Vice-Chairperson Lukowicz, Helen Quinn, Ronald Flynn, Daniel Lantz and Richard Polselli. District Manager Gayle A. Corrigan and District Administrator Dan Kaplan were also present. Director Cindy Fagan-Perry, Chief Frank Brown and legal counsel David M. D'Agostino, Esq. of Gorham & Gorham were excused. After the pledge, the Chairman reviewed safety instructions for exiting the room.

A motion to accept the minutes from May 17, 2018 was made by Director Flynn, seconded by Vice Chairperson Lukowicz and unanimously approved.

District Manager Gayle Corrigan read the Fire Chief's Report into the record. Motion to accept the Chief's report was made by Director Polselli, seconded by Director Quinn and unanimously approved. Administrator Kaplan read the Tax Collection Report into the record. A motion to accept the Administrator's report was made by Director Polselli, seconded by Vice Chairperson Lukowicz and unanimously approved. District Manager Corrigan read the Financial Report. A motion to accept the report was made by Director Flynn, seconded by Vice Chairperson Lukowicz and unanimously approved.

Under New Business, the Board was asked by the Johnsons Pond Civic Association for some relief from the CCFD Fire Detail expense for the July 4th fireworks display. A motion to reduce the cost of the fire detail by \$1500 was presented by Director Polselli, seconded by Vice Chairperson Lukowicz and approved with one dissenting vote by Director Lantz. A motion to table a list of properties for tax abatements until the July meeting was made by Director Quinn, seconded by Director Polselli and unanimously approved.

A motion to charge Verizon for the space for equipment at the Washington Street Station was made by Vice Chairperson Lukowicz, seconded by Director Quinn and unanimously approved.

A presentation by representatives from PRISM regarding the street lights in the District was presented. A motion by Vice Chairperson Lukowicz to proceed with an audit of the lights was seconded by Director Quinn and approved with one dissenting vote by Director Polselli.

A motion to adjourn was made by Director Polselli, seconded by Director Flynn and unanimously approved.

FIRE CHIEF'S JULY REPORT

Summary of Operation activities:

PERSONNEL

Currently we have 27 members on staff. 1 member on long term injury (OJI). 2 New Probationary Firefighters were hired with a starting date of Monday, July 23rd. They will go thru 4 weeks of on the job training before being placed on a shift.

TOTAL PERSONNEL - 30

EMERGENCY INCIDENTS

- * Crews responded to report of a male ill outside of his car. Upon inspection of the vehicle that he was in crews found chemicals related to pest control. RIDEM was called due to the nature of the chemicals. As a precaution two Firefighters were evaluated at KCMH for chemical exposure.
- *Crews responded to a small deck fire. Fire was determined to be discarded smoking material.
- *Marine 7 responded to two incidents on Johnson's Pond involving jet skis.
- *Total Incidents for the year ending June 30th was 1881.
